The Norris Center supports natural history learning by curating important natural history collections, teaching field-based classes, supporting hands-on internships, strengthening connections among disciplines - especially art and science, mentoring students to be future environmental leaders and teachers, and building lasting communities and professional networks.

Who Are the Friends of the Norris Center?

The Friends of the Norris Center (FNC) is a group of community members and students dedicated to advancing the mission of the Kenneth S. Norris Center for Natural History. FNC members work to build a community of people who carry their passion for the natural world into all aspects of their lives.

FNC's goals include:

- Advancing natural history training and Norris Center activities
- Providing community/alumni engagement and professional development networks
- Helping expand Norris Center programming
- Supporting Norris Center research on natural history and field-based education
- Increasing public outreach, advocacy, and financial support for the Norris Center

In 2022-2023 the Norris Center...

- Engaged with 1,818 students and 310 community members.
- Supported 34 classes, 76 quarterly internship positions, and 5 public events, for a total of 8,368 user days!
- Funded 30 paid quarterly positions, 8 class scholarhips and 6 project awards.
- Partnered with new groups on campus while holding a variety of events, including a Day of the Dead gathering, and celebration of the Annais Rittenberg Natural History Field Quarter scholarship program.
- Sponsored a large diverse set of student-led projects, from new field guides to novel artscience collaborations.
- Sent our paid student curators to the Society for the Preservation of Natural History Collections (SPNHC) annual conference.
